Please tell your GP or pharmacist if you feel you don't need any of your prescribed medicines.





How can you help your local NHS tackle the problem of medicines waste?

- Discuss your medicines with your GP or pharmacist on a regular basis
- Let your GP or pharmacist know if you are having difficulty with any of your medicines, have stopped taking any, or take less than instructed
- Check what medicines you have at home before re-ordering your prescription

How can you help your local NHS tackle the problem of medicines waste?

- If you don't need the medicine, don't order it! If you need the medicine in the future you can still request it
- If your pharmacy or anyone else order your medicines, let them know if there are any you don't need
- If your medicines run out at different times, ask your GP to synchronise them
- I you need to go into hospital, take all your medicines with you

REMEMBER

- Medicines should not be used after their expiry date
- Unwanted or out of date medicines should be returned to a pharmacy for safe disposal
- Unwanted medicines cannot be reused for other patients
- Your medicines are prescribed for you. It is not safe to share them with anyone else.
